Training Overview

The 12-hour training will focus on the unique needs of front-line officers, investigators, and street supervisors. An expert law enforcement officer, prosecutor, and domestic violence advocate will team-teach law enforcement to appropriately respond to and investigate domestic violence, dating violence, and stalking cases.

Training Outcomes

Increase officer and victim safety, and increase offender accountability to prevent future abuse

Identify interviewing, evidence gathering, and probable cause determination techniques to investigate and report Domestic Violence, Dating Violence, and Stalking crimes more effectively

Identify liability issues for law enforcement agencies and apply practices to potentially decrease risk of lawsuits

Understand dynamics of domestic violence

Identify the unique needs of responding to and investigating cases involving underserved populations

Identify the essential components of the decision to arrest

Understand all aspects of protection orders

Apply federal domestic violence laws
