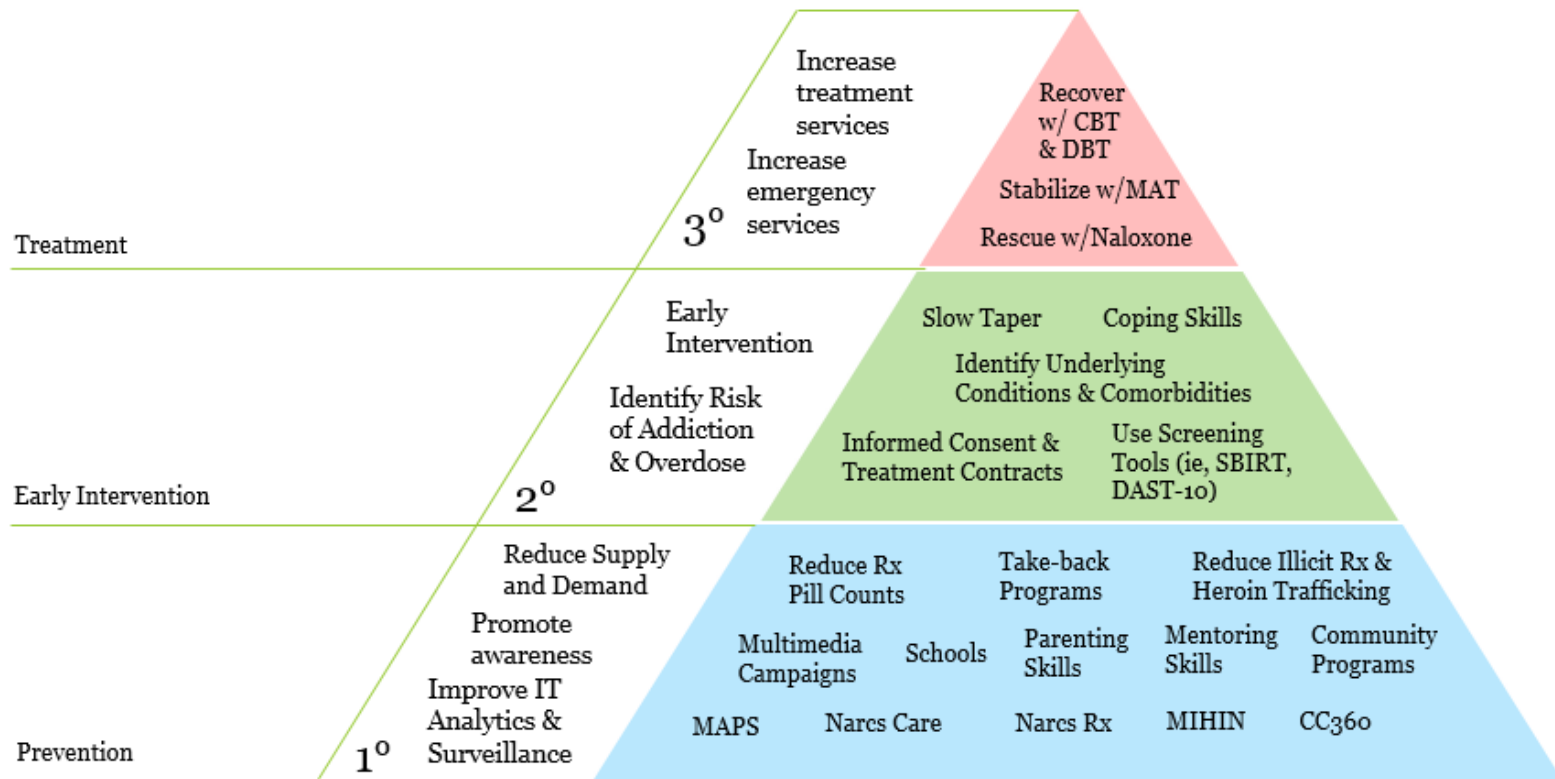

Funding Sources

- Medicaid
- Healthy Michigan
- Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Block Grant
- General Fund
- Other grants
 - State Targeted Response (STR)
 - Centers for Disease Control (CDC)

Services Funded by Medicaid

Services funded include:

- Medication Assisted Treatment
- Detoxification
- Outpatient Services
- Case Management

Medicaid & Healthy Michigan

- Medicaid paid over \$41 million in substance use disorder services providing services to 31,101 beneficiaries in fiscal year 2016
- Healthy Michigan paid over \$53 million in substance use disorder services providing services to 28,850 beneficiaries in fiscal year 2016

SAMHSA Block Grant

- Prescription Drug and Opioid Overdose Prevention
- Opioid Overdose Recovery
- Innovative Strategies for Enhancing Treatment Services to Pregnant Women
- Drug Court Peer Recovery Support

Opioid STR Grant

- The MDHHS was awarded a 2-year State Targeted Response to the Opioid Crisis (STR) Grant from SAMHSA in April 2017 for \$16,372,680 per year
- This grant can be used for interventions related to:
 - Prevention
 - Treatment
 - Recovery

Opioid STR Grant

- Support for improvements to Michigan's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (MAPS)
- Improving the availability of Naloxone
 - Red Project – training on how to use Naloxone kits, and how to obtain kits
- Providing a new model for prisoner re-entry population with co-occurring Opioid Use and Mental Health Disorders
- Increase peer recovery supports
- Naloxone for State Police

Other MDHHS Efforts

- Increased surveillance – Increased funds to better identify causes of death
- Policy academy to reduce Neonatal Abstinence Syndrome
- Support of HARM Reduction Strategies
 - Naloxone standing order – Half of all pharmacies in Michigan participating
 - Syringe Service Programs
